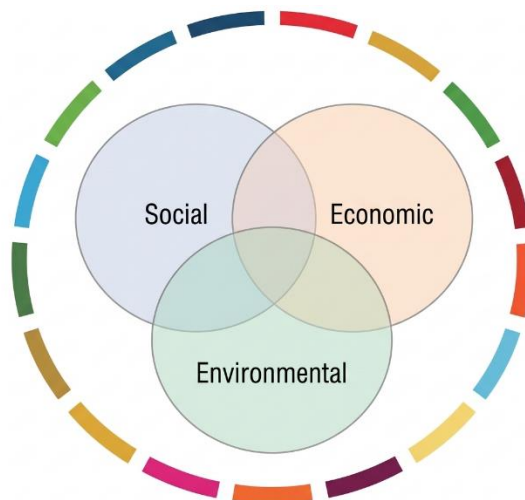
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OVERVIEW

The concept of sustainable development was propagated by the Brundtland commission Report released in 1987 as “Development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.” At the Millennium Summit held in 2000 at the United Nations Headquarters in New York, world leaders adopted eight development goals known as the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). The MDG framework consisted of 8 goals, 18 targets, and 53 indicators, which guided national and international development efforts from 2000 to 2015. However, the framework primarily focused on selected social and economic development issues, with limited attention to environmental sustainability and other emerging global challenges. The MDG targets were unevenly achieved across the countries and a need was felt to start fresh discussions to explore possible successor to guide development cooperation in the world beyond 2015.

With the aim of taking forward the success of Millennium Development Goals, the United Nations (UN) General Assembly, in its 70th Session held in September 2015, adopted the document titled "Transforming our World: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development" consisting of 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and associated 169 targets. The SDGs, also known as the Global Goals, are the blueprint for achieving a better and sustainable future for the planet, the people, while attaining prosperity, peace and partnership.



Dimensions of Development of Sustainable Development Goals

The SDGs came into force with effect from 1st January, 2016. The SDGs are a comprehensive list of global goals integrating social, economic and environmental dimensions of development. Moreover, the SDGs are universal (for all nations – developed, developing and least developed countries), interconnected and indivisible and hence necessitate comprehensive and participatory approaches in bringing everybody together so that no one is left behind. The 5Ps or pillars – people, planet, prosperity, peace and partnership- capture the broad scope of the agenda. Countries are primarily responsible for following up and reviewing the progress made in implementing the goals and targets at the national level till 2030.



The SDGs are not legally binding, but have become de-facto international obligations and have potential to reorient domestic spending priorities of the countries. The 2030 Agenda also underscored the fact that quality, reliable and disaggregated data would be needed for measurement of progress on the targets and for ensuring that “No One is Left Behind”.

The United Nations Statistical Commission (UNSC) in March 2015, created the Inter-agency and Expert Group on SDG Indicators (IAEG-SDGs), composed of Member States and including regional and international agencies as observers with a task to develop and implement the Global Indicator Framework (GIF) for monitoring the Goals and Targets of the 2030 Agenda. India represented South Asia in the IAEG-SDGs during 2015-2019. The GIF was developed by the IAEG-SDGs and agreed upon by the United Nations Statistical Commission in March 2017 which was subsequently adopted by the UN General Assembly in July 2017.

Global Indicator Framework

Initially, a total of 244 indicators were identified in the GIF for monitoring the progress of Global SDGs and associated targets out of which some indicators were repeated under two or three different targets making the distinct global indicators as 232. The GIF was comprehensively reviewed by IAEG-SDGs in 2020, following detailed discussions with various stakeholders and accordingly the GIF was revised which included 247 indicators, with 231 unique indicators. In 2025, the GIF underwent a comprehensive review, involving extensive dialogues with diverse stakeholders. Additionally, the GIF undergoes annual refinement. As of now, the GIF encompasses 251 indicators, out of which 234 are unique.

India is committed to implement the SDGs based on the nationally defined indicators responding to national priorities and needs. The Government is committed to ensuring “Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas” in the spirit of the Sustainable Development Goals’ motto of “Leaving No One Behind”.

NITI Aayog

National Institution for Transforming India (NITI Aayog) is the nodal institution to coordinate all the SDG efforts at the national and sub-national levels and has the responsibility to align/map Central Government sponsored schemes/programmes to SDGs. NITI Aayog is facilitating and coordinating the implementation of SDGs in the country and also undertaking comparative analysis of SDG achievement in the States and UTs. NITI Aayog is also working with States/UTs on localization of SDGs.

National Indicator Framework

Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) is the nodal Ministry of Government of India for the development of the National Indicator Framework (NIF) for tracking the progress of the SDGs and associated targets at national level. NIF is the backbone for facilitating monitoring of SDGs at the national level and provides appropriate direction to the policy makers and implementing agencies of various schemes and programmes. Towards this endeavour, MoSPI developed the NIF in 2018 consisting of 306 national indicators along with identified data sources and periodicity following due consultation process with concerned Ministries/ Departments, UN Agencies and other stakeholders. MoSPI periodically reviews and refines the NIF in consultation with relevant stakeholders. There are 284 national SDG indicators in the NIF 2025. MoSPI is also working to



strengthen the capacity of State Governments and UT Administrations by providing guidance and support for the effective monitoring and assessment of SDG progress at the State and local levels.

State Indicator Framework

The State Indicator Framework (SIF) is a key instrument for tracking SDG progress at the State level, enabling evidence-based decision-making and supporting the effective implementation of Government schemes and programmes. To strengthen SDG monitoring at the State level, DES developed Delhi State Indicator Framework (DSIF) aligned with the NIF at the national level. In September 2025, DES published the first edition of Status Report on DSIF for the year 2024 following due consultation process with concerned line departments and other stakeholders. This report encompassed 226 Indicators against 16 Goals and associated Targets.

The DSIF- Status Report provides an overview of the progress made by Delhi on SDGs which serves as the foundational tool for monitoring and addressing data gaps for achieving SDGs at the State level. This report contains data snapshots accompanied by data sources and periodicity pooled from difference reliable national and state sources.

Publicity and Awareness on SDGs

In the year 2026, DES organised a training/workshop programme on SDGs to spread awareness among line departments of GNCTD. Further, handouts were distributed among line departments of GNCTD and Ministries/Departments of Govt. of India.

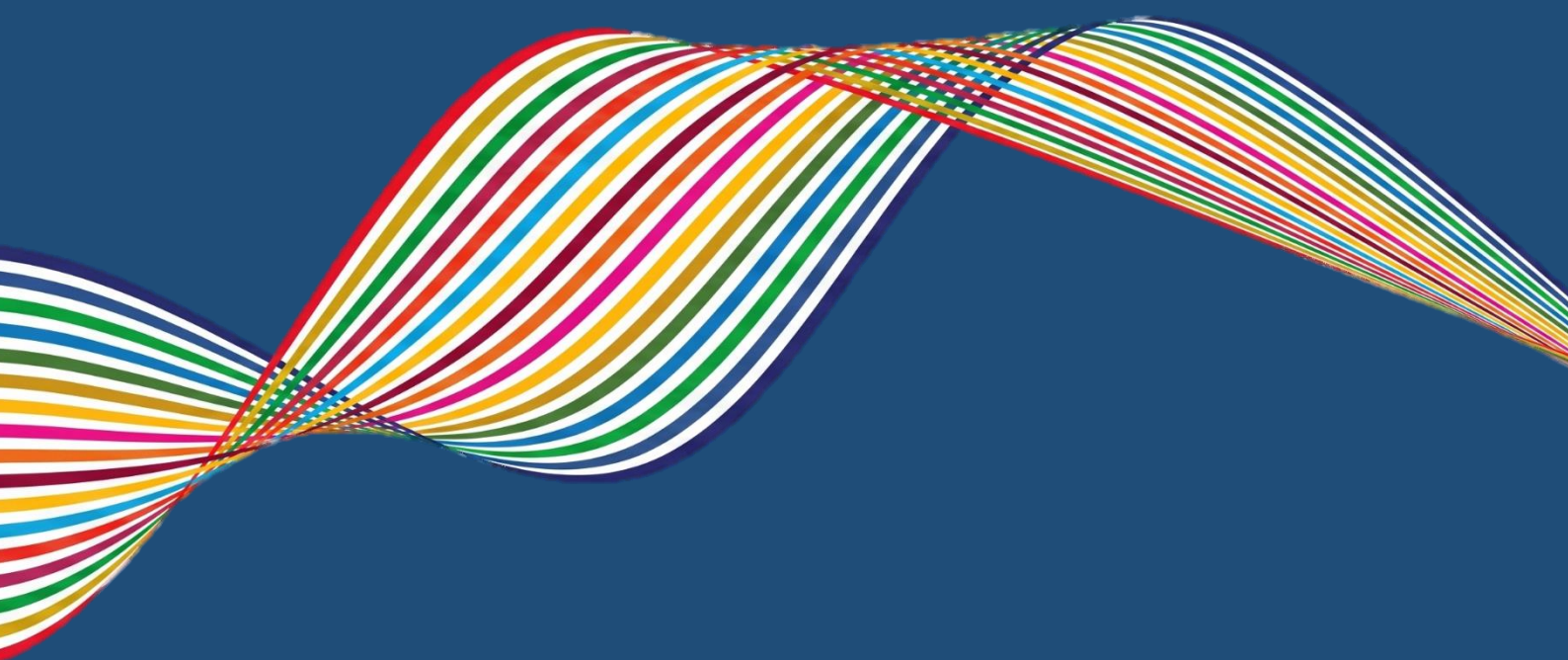

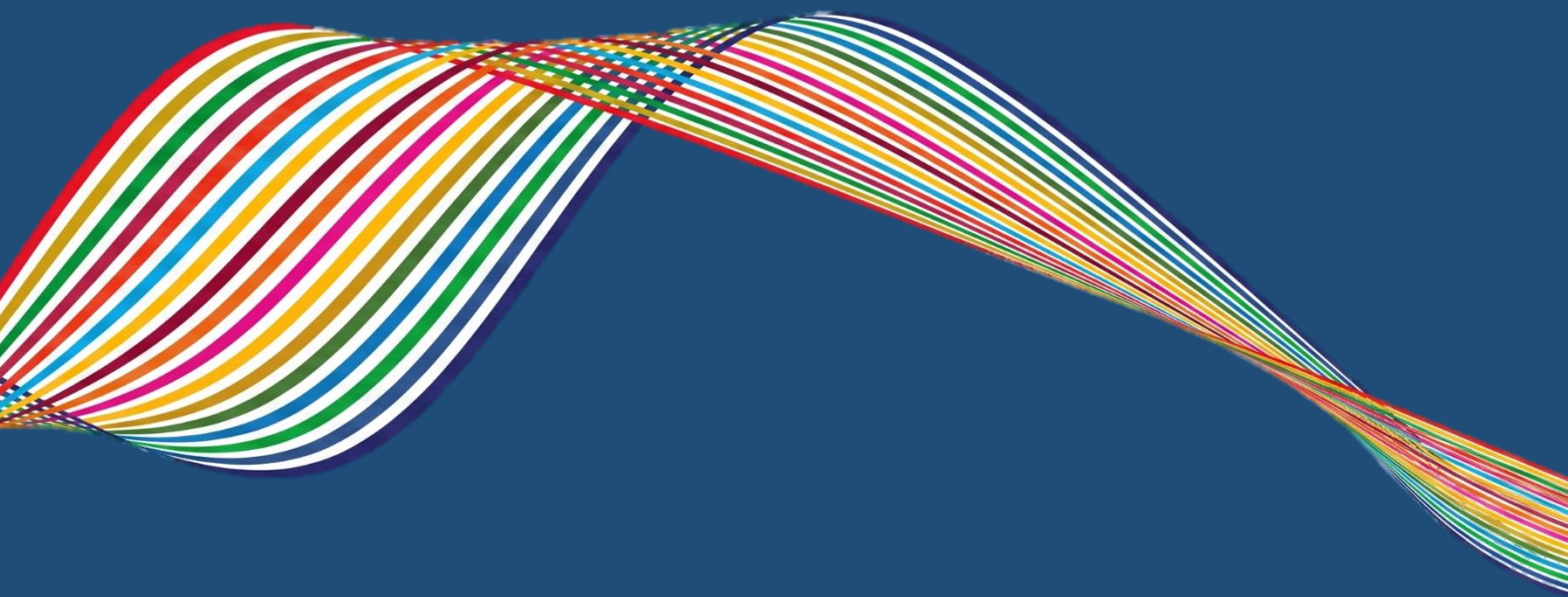

No Poverty

End poverty in all its forms everywhere

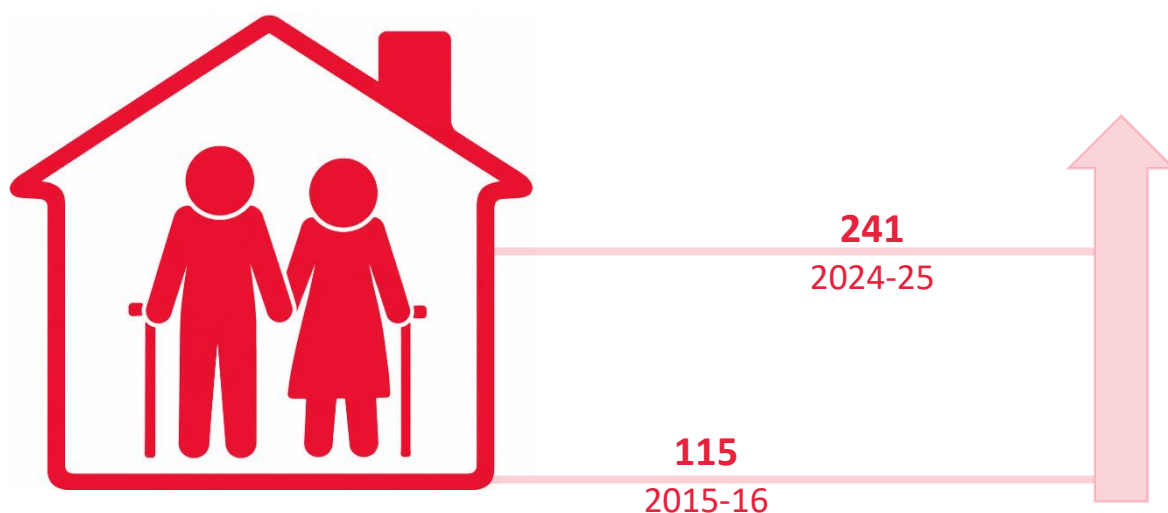
SDG 1 seeks to end poverty in all its manifestations, including its most extreme forms. Poverty is not merely a lack of income and resources needed to ensure a sustainable livelihood. Its manifestations include hunger and malnutrition; limited access to education and other basic services; social discrimination and exclusion; as well as a lack of participation in decision-making. Eradicating poverty in all its forms remains one of the most formidable challenge facing mankind. One should not forget that extreme deprivation is not just about well-being and opportunity; it is a question of survival as well. This goal focuses on ensuring equal access to resources and opportunities, implementing social protection systems, and addressing the root causes of poverty. By enhancing economic growth, providing social safety nets, and fostering inclusive development, we can work towards a world where no one lives in poverty. The Government is implementing various welfare schemes focused on nutrition, health, education, housing, drinking water, sanitation, skill development, and social protection.

At the global level, this goal has **7 targets** to eliminate poverty in all its forms. At the national level, **13 indicators**, while at the state level, **18 indicators** under the Delhi State Indicator Framework have been identified to measure and monitor the progress of these targets.

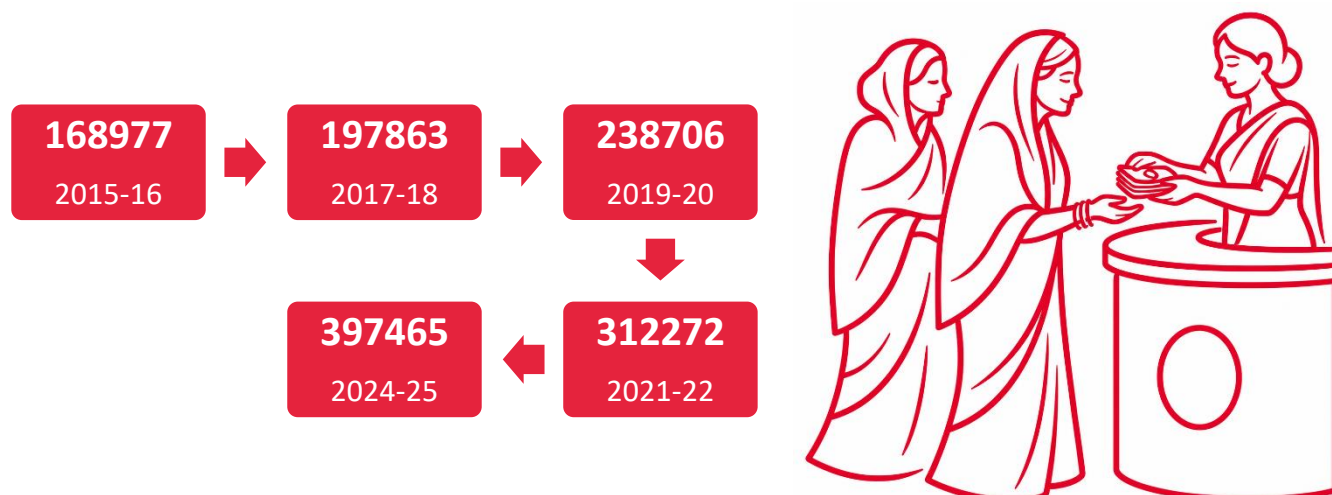




Number of **senior citizens provided institutional assistance** through Senior Citizens Homes/Day Care Centers funded by the Government

Zero Hunger

End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition and promote sustainable agriculture

SDG 2 seeks sustainable solutions to end hunger in all its forms and to achieve food security. It addresses not only the issue of hunger but also underlying causes like inequality, climate change, and inefficient agricultural practices. The aim is to ensure that everyone, everywhere has enough good-quality food to lead a healthy life. This goal addresses multiple dimensions, including undernourishment, all forms of malnutrition - such as stunting, wasting, and micronutrient deficiencies, and broader issues of food security that affect physical growth, cognitive development, and overall well-being. Hunger remains a major barrier to human potential, health outcomes, economic productivity, and social stability. A number of initiatives have been taken by the Government to ensure food for all and it has launched one of the largest food security programs in the form of the National Food Security Act, 2013.

At the global level, this goal has **8 targets** to achieve zero hunger. At the national level, **19 indicators**, while at the state level, **12 indicators** under the Delhi State Indicator Framework have been identified to measure and monitor the progress of these targets.

Good Health and Well-Being

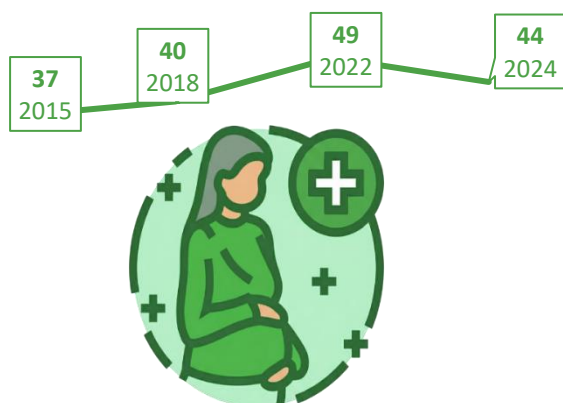
Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages

SDG 3 seeks to ensure health and well-being for all, at every stage of life. Good health and well-being is essential for leading a fulfilling and productive life. This goal aims to address all major health priorities, including improving reproductive, maternal and child health; reducing child mortality; achieving universal health coverage; and ensuring access to safe, effective, quality and affordable medicines and vaccines. It also focuses on ending the epidemics of HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria and other diseases that impact the overall well-being of an individual, burden families and public resources, and weaken societies. This goal further envisages addressing the various emerging health issues in an ever-changing world. Delhi is committed to providing equitable and affordable access to quality health care services for its residents and to reducing morbidity and mortality rates through a decline in both communicable and non-communicable diseases. The Government health sector policies aim to ensure universal health services at affordable prices.

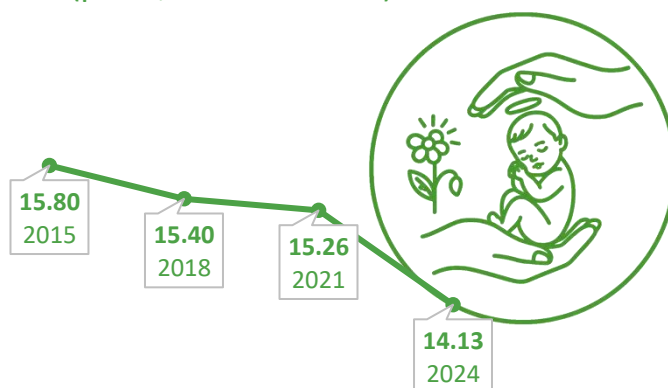

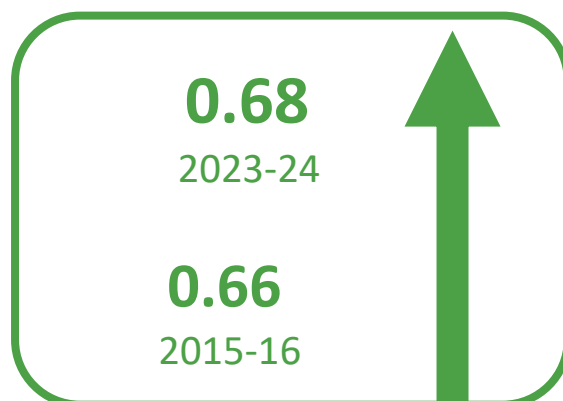
Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR) (per 1,00,000 live births)

Quality Education

Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all

SDG 4 aims to ensure that all people have access to quality education and lifelong learning opportunities which are central to enabling a full and productive life for all individuals and to the realization of sustainable development. It refers to an education system and approach that provide students with the knowledge, skills and competencies essential for personal development, future careers, and active participation in society. This goal aims to ensure the completion of primary and secondary education for all boys and girls, and to guarantee opportunities for equal access to quality technical and vocational education for everyone. Quality education is hampered by the lack of trained teachers and inadequate school facilities. Despite considerable progress in school enrolment, many children remain out of school. This gap highlights the need for policymakers to refocus their efforts to ensure that the quality of education is improved, and that more people of all ages can access it. Delhi has made significant progress in improving school infrastructure and the ambience of government schools, enhancing pedagogical practices, expanding scholarship opportunities and improving the level of gender parity.

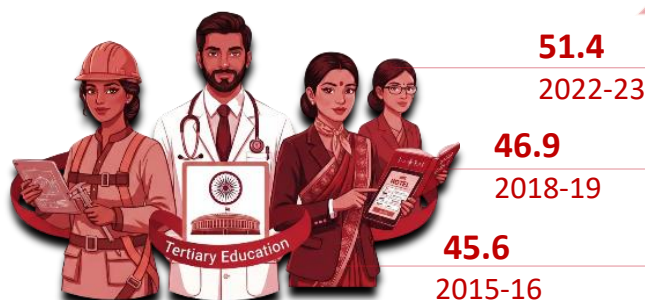

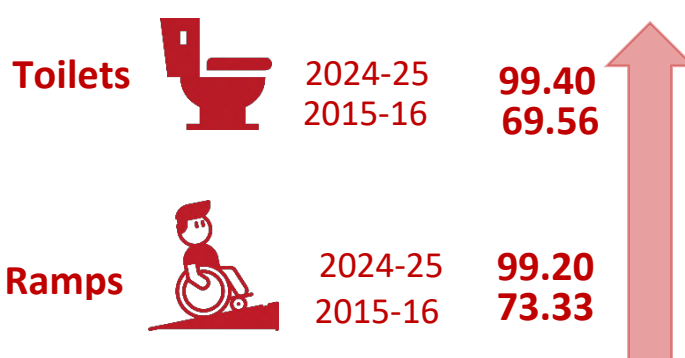

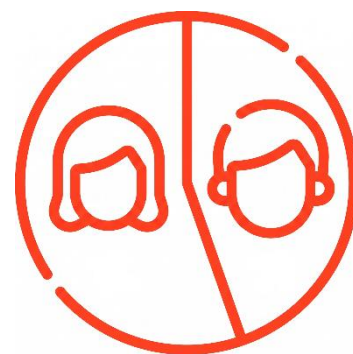
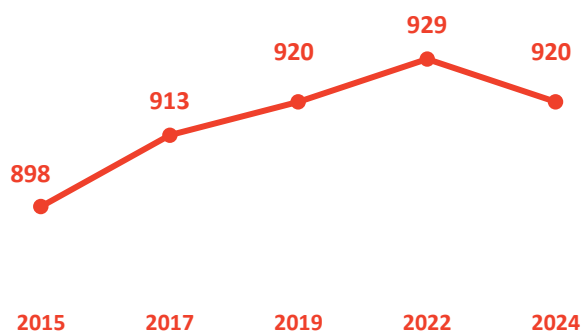
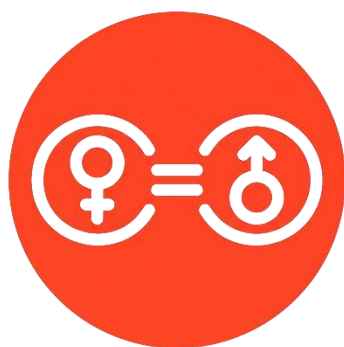
Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls

SDG 5 aims to end all forms of discrimination against women and girls everywhere. It ensures equal rights, opportunities, and treatment for all individuals, irrespective of their gender. It is not only a basic human right but also crucial for the sustainable future of societies. There are still gross inequalities in access to paid employment in some regions, and significant gaps between men and women in the labour market. Sexual violence and exploitation, the unequal division of unpaid care and domestic work, and discrimination in public decision-making all remain huge barriers. It is vital to ensure that women have equal rights to land and property, access to sexual and reproductive health services and equal opportunities in technology and the internet usage. Ensuring that women have better access to paid employment and real decision-making power in public and private spheres will further ensure that development is equitable and sustainable. The Government has initiated several social protection and financial inclusion programs focused on women which have contributed to increased women's participation.

At the global level, this goal has **9 targets** to achieve gender equality. At the national level, **28 indicators**, while at the state level, **29 indicators** under the Delhi State Indicator Framework have been identified to measure and monitor the progress of these targets.

Clean Water and Sanitation

Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all

SDG 6 emphasizes the importance of clean water and sanitation in human life. Clean water and sanitation are essential for promoting good health, preventing the spread of diseases, and ensuring overall well-being. Access to clean water and proper sanitation facilities is a fundamental human right and a crucial aspect of sustainable development. This goal aims to address challenges related to drinking water, sanitation and hygiene for all populations as well as issues related to water-related ecosystems. Without sustainable water resources and sanitation services, progress in many other areas across the SDGs—including health, education and poverty reduction, will be constrained. Water scarcity, poor water quality and inadequate sanitation negatively affect food security, livelihood choices and educational opportunities for poor families across the world. Despite having a huge demand for water, with limited water resources, Delhi has committed to providing its population with safe and adequate drinking water.

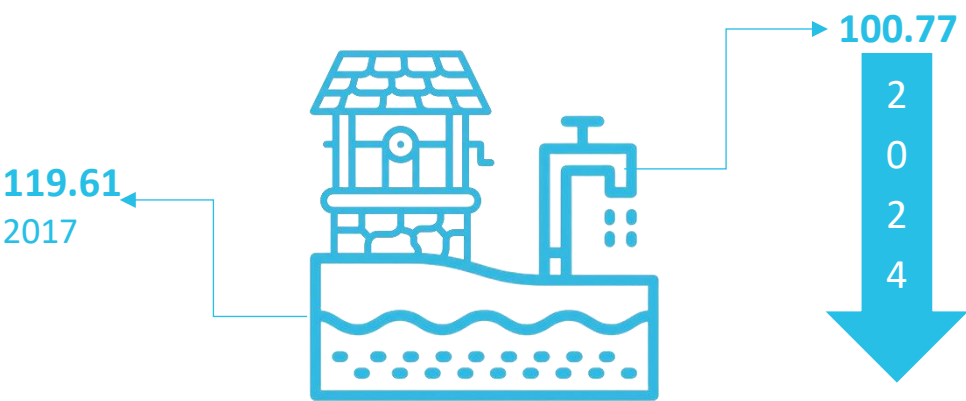

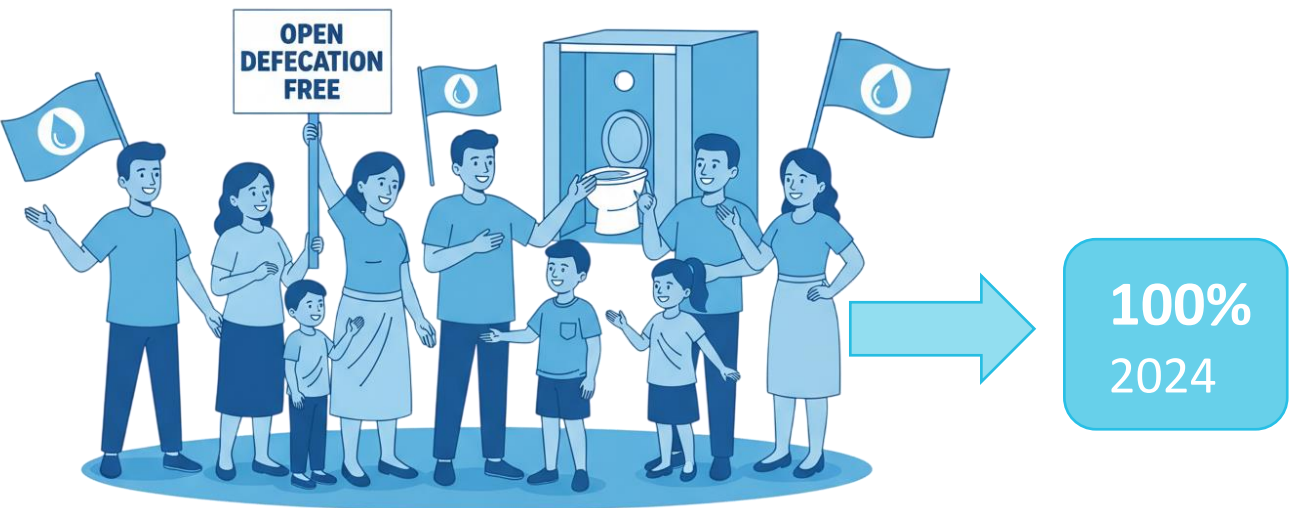
Percentage of population using an improved source of drinking water

Affordable and Clean Energy

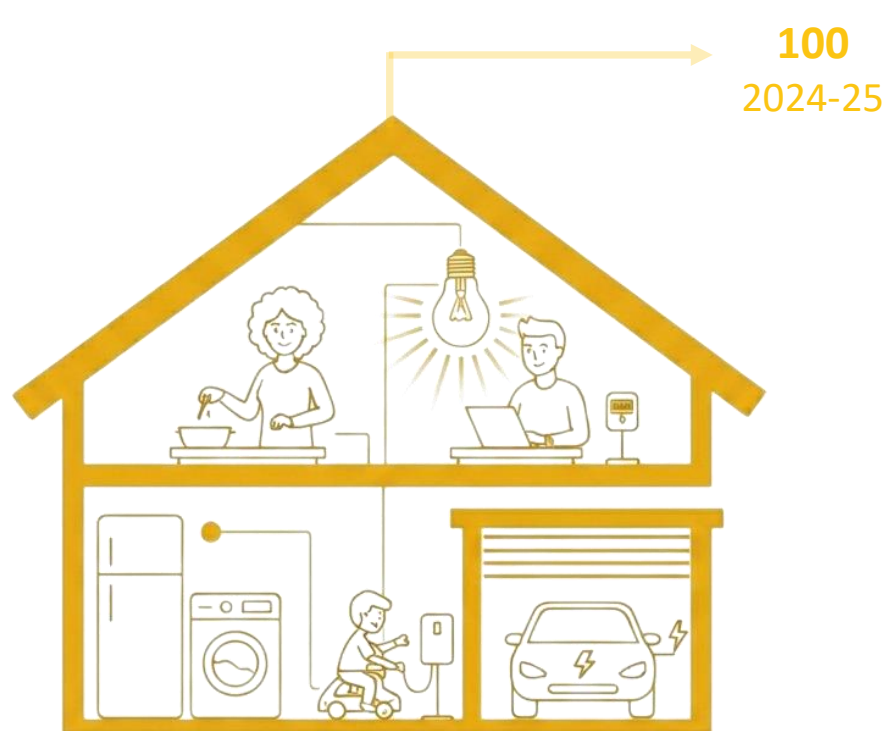
Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable and modern energy for all

SDG 7 seeks to promote universal access to affordable, reliable, and sustainable energy services. Achieving this goal requires expanding access to electricity and clean cooking fuels and technologies, improving energy efficiency, and accelerating the adoption of renewable energy sources. It aims to ensure the availability of energy that is both environmentally friendly and economically viable. Energy plays a critical role in driving economic growth and cannot be undermined in the development process of societies. 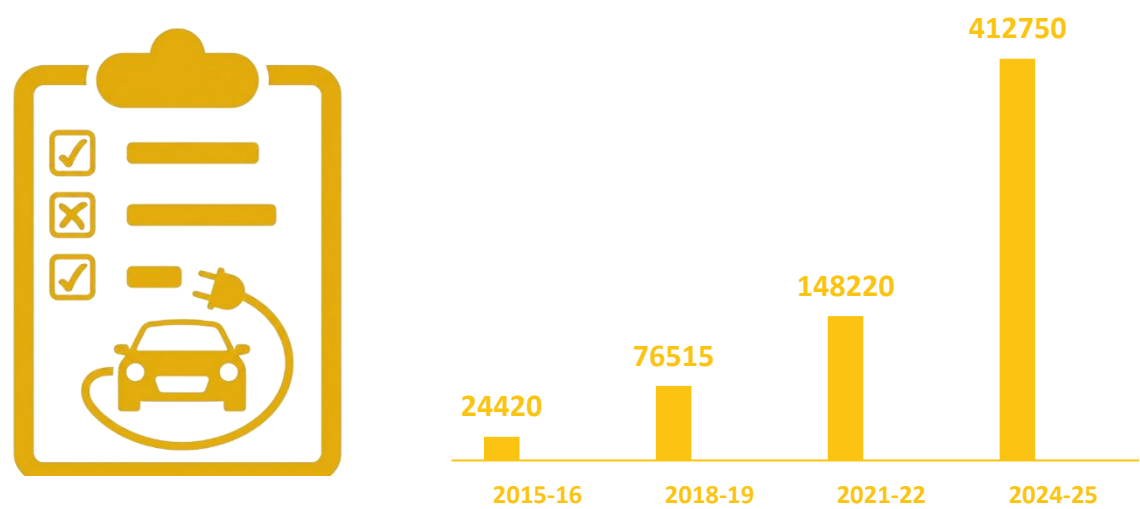

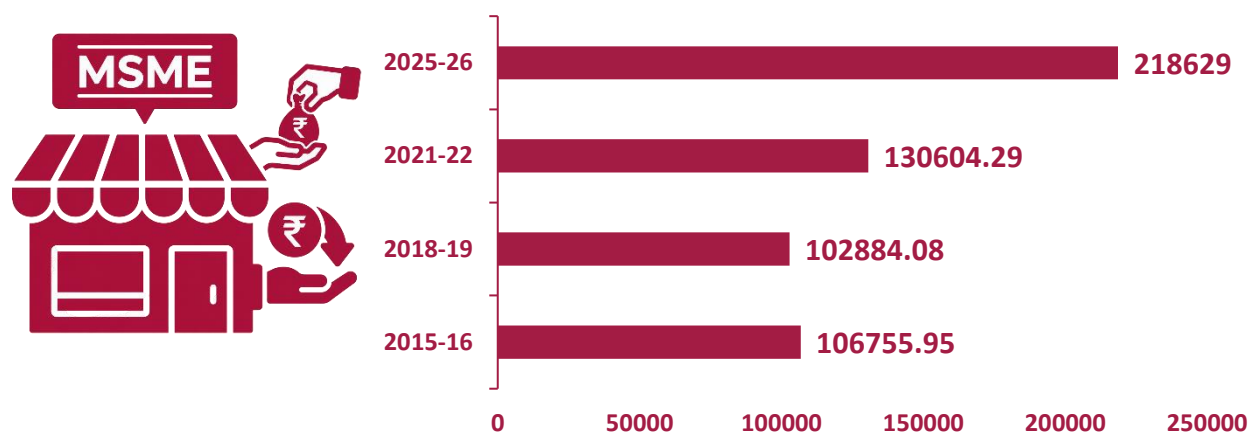
Promote sustained, inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all

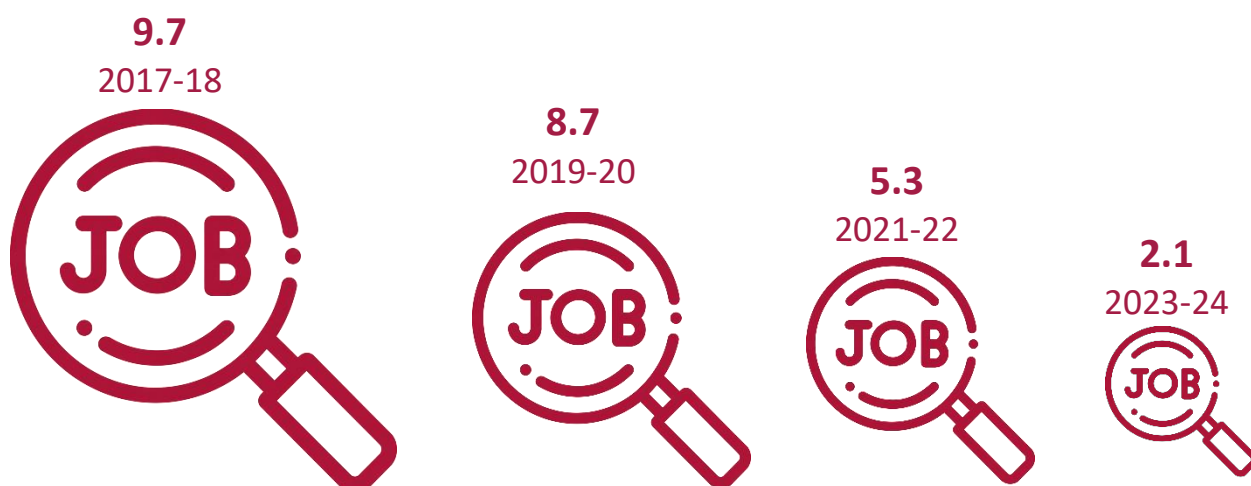

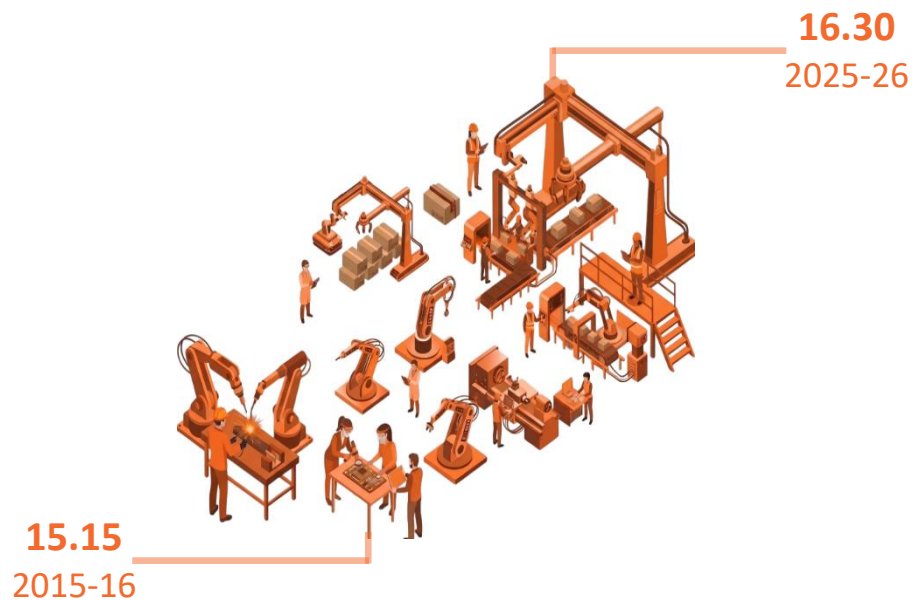
Build resilient infrastructure, promote inclusive and sustainable industrialization and foster innovation

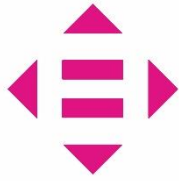

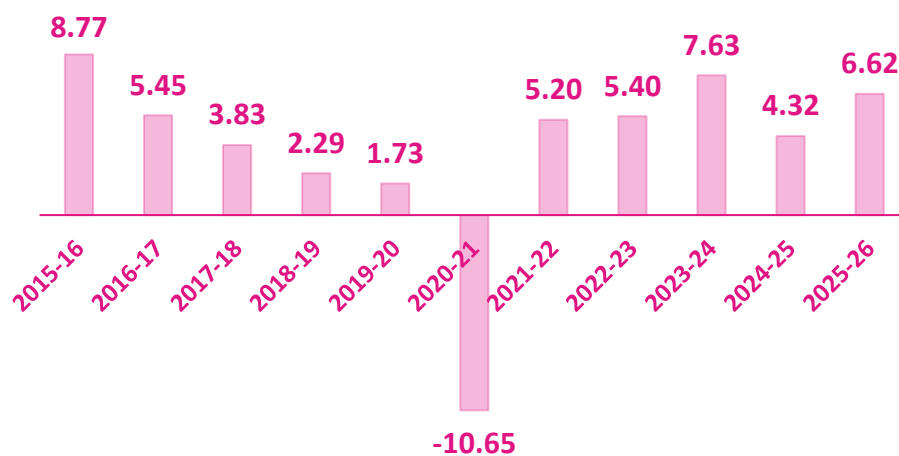
Reduce inequality within and among countries

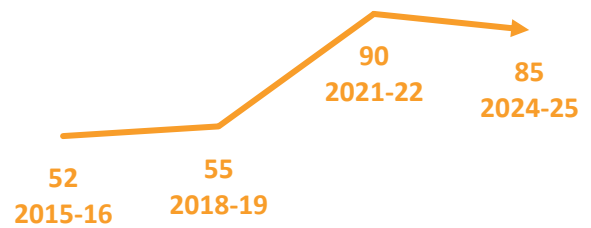

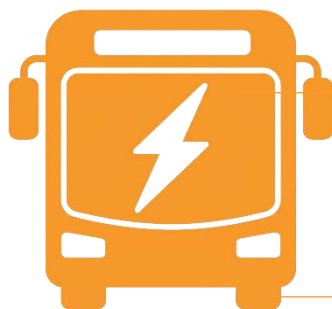

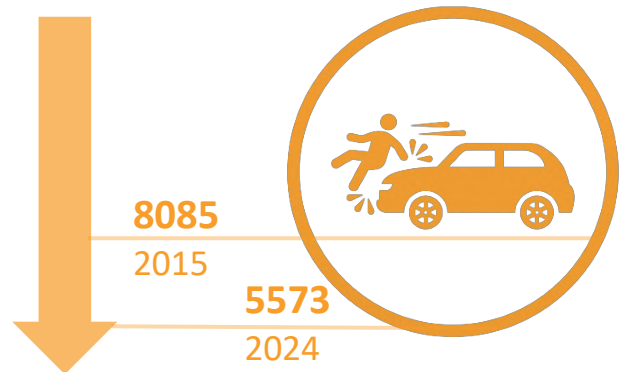
Percentage of Waste Processed



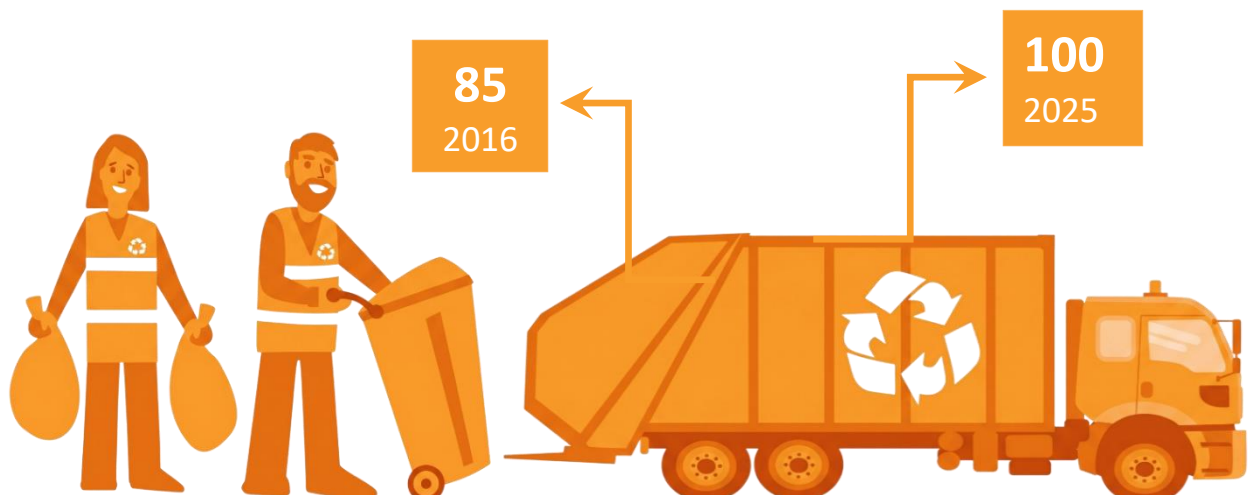

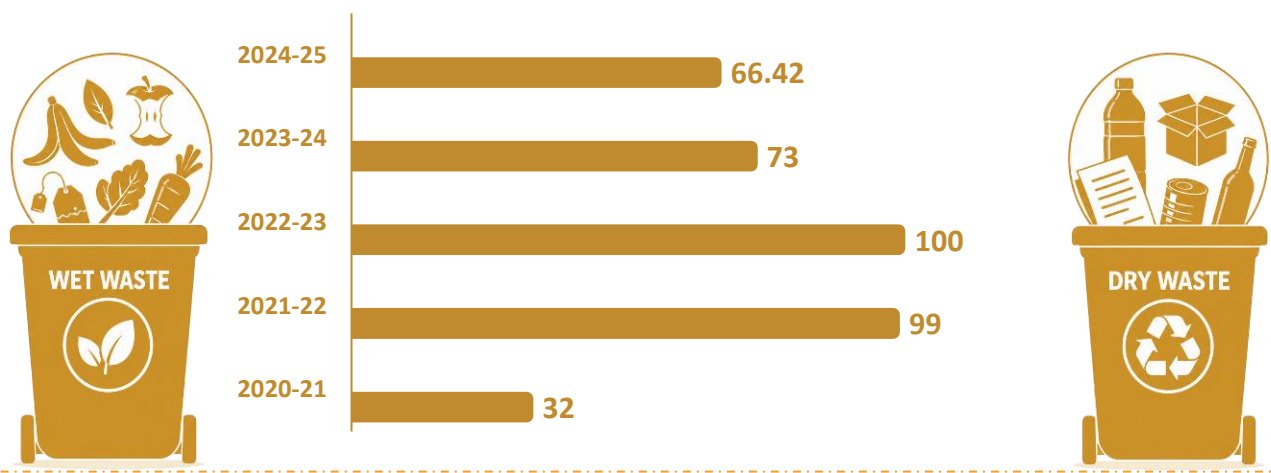
Ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns

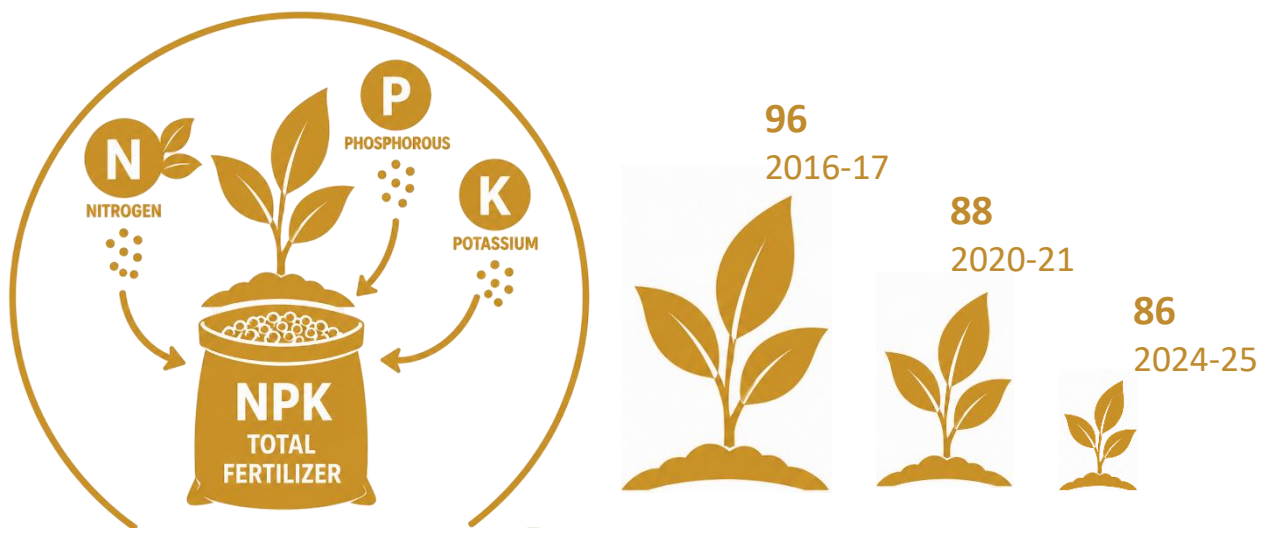

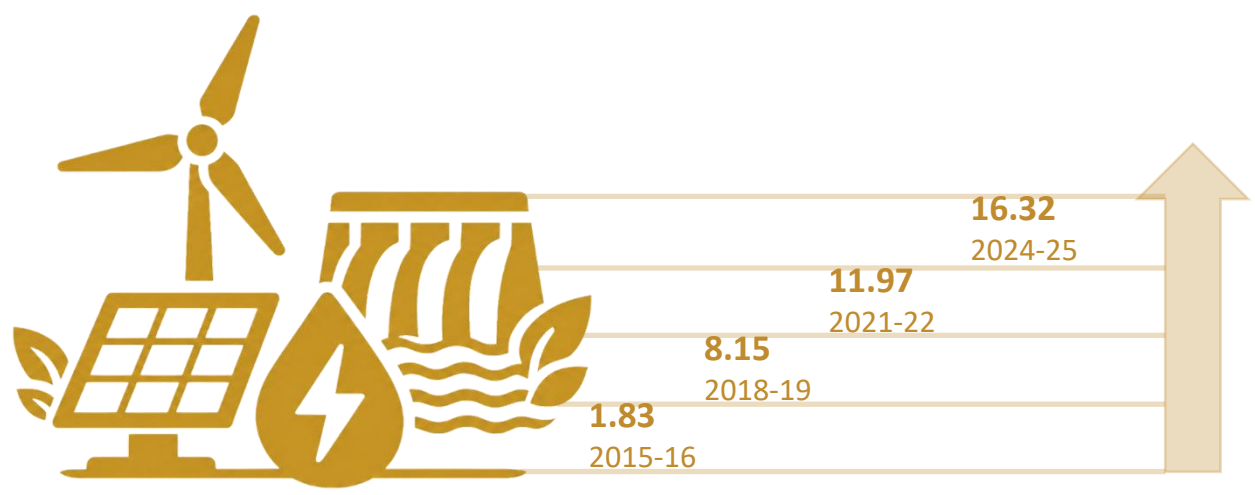
Percentage of wards with **100% source segregation**

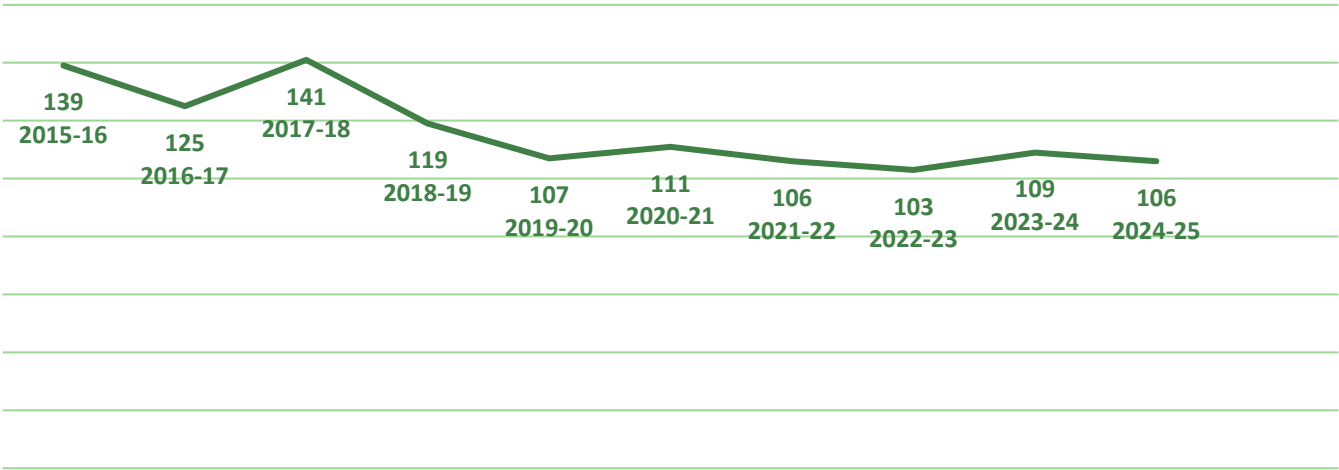
Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts

SDG 13 aims to take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts by regulating emissions and promoting the development of renewable energy. The world is experiencing rising sea levels, extreme weather events, and increasing concentrations of greenhouse gases which are threatening the lives of all. With rising greenhouse gas emissions, ambitious plans and accelerated actions are required for both mitigation and adaptation to impacts of climate change, including access to finance and strengthened institutional and technical capacities. Goal 13 emphasizes building resilience and adaptive capacity to climate-related hazards and integrating such measures into national policies. 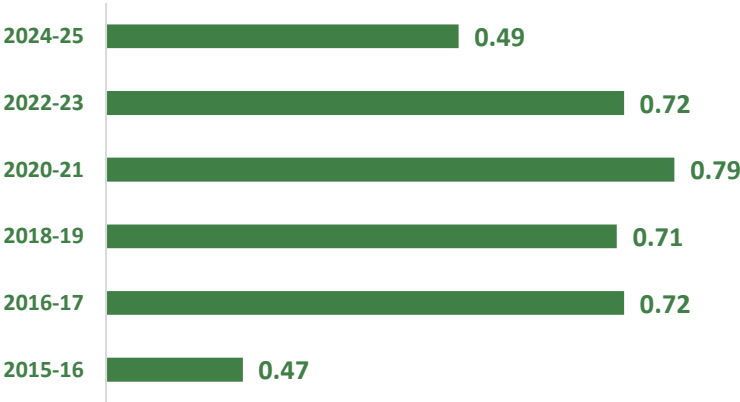
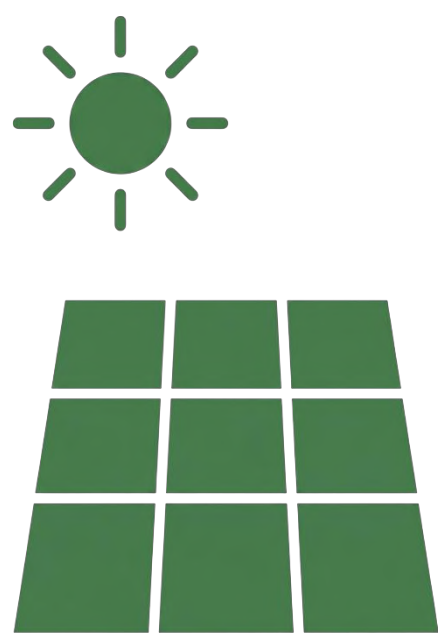

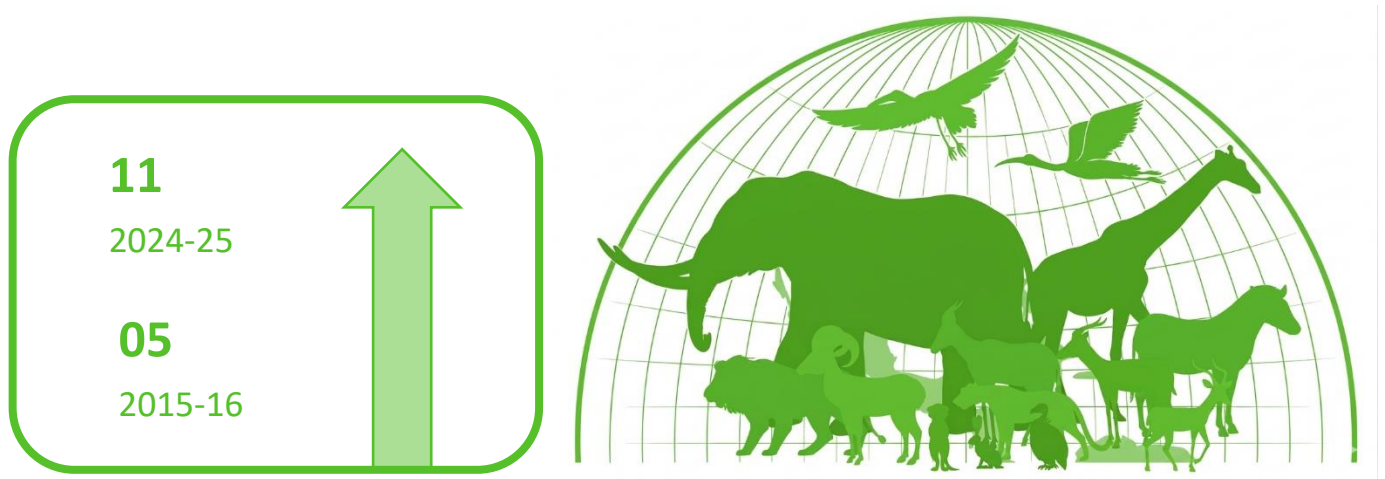
Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss

SDG 15 aims to protect, restore and promote the sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, ensure the sustainable management of forests, restore of land affected by desertification and land degradation, and integrate ecosystems and biodiversity into national and local planning. Human life depends on healthy terrestrial ecosystems for sustenance and livelihoods. Healthy ecosystems - such as forests, wetlands, mountains, and drylands provide multiple environmental goods and services including clean air and water, biodiversity conservation and climate change mitigation. It also seeks to promote the fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising from the utilization of genetic resources and prevent poaching and trafficking of protected species of flora and fauna. Furthermore, it stresses the need to significantly reduce deforestation rates and actively promote large-scale reforestation and afforestation programmes.

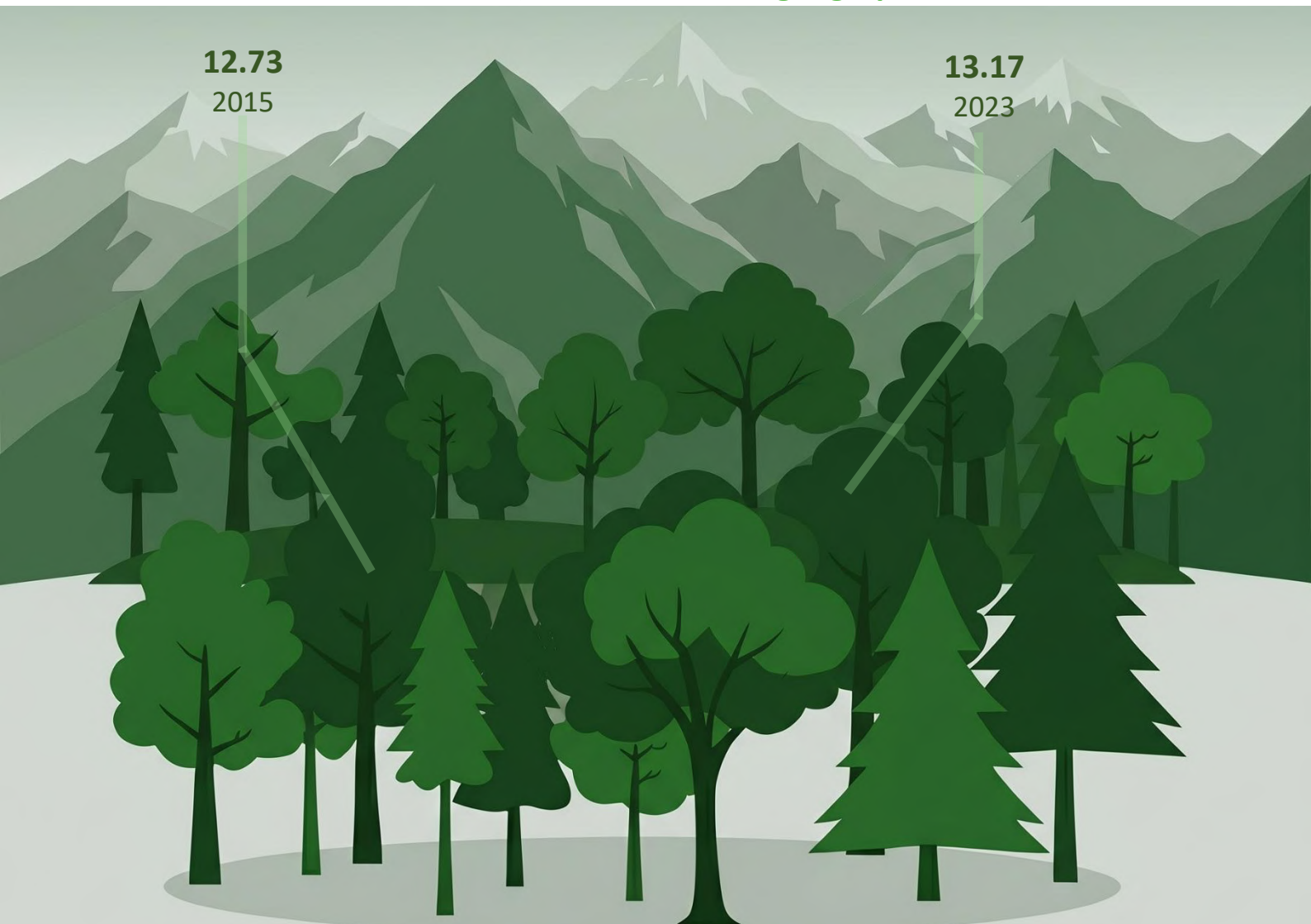

Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels

SDG 16 aims to foster peaceful and inclusive societies, ensure access to justice for everyone and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels. Violence and armed conflicts represents one of the most significant and destructive challenge to the development, growth, and wellbeing of societies. The global sustainable development agenda for 2030 promotes transparent and effective local governance and judicial systems, the reduction of crime and sexual and gender based violence, the prevention of homicide and trafficking cases and also the protection of children's rights. It seeks to address violence at all levels – individual, relational, community and societal. It emphasizes strengthening the rule of law and ensuring equal access to legal systems particularly for the most vulnerable populations. 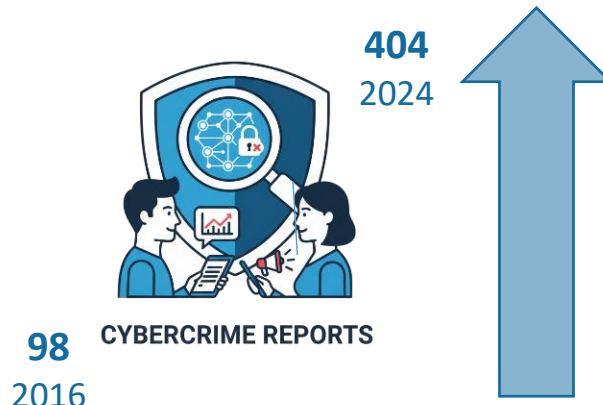

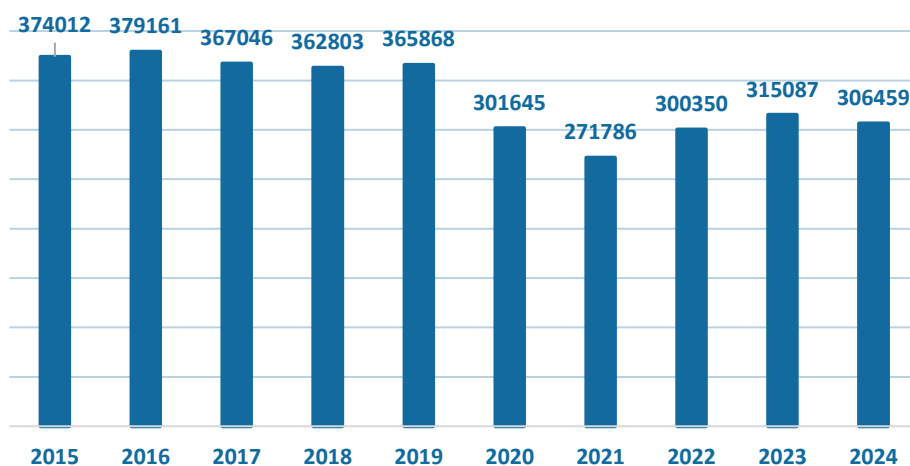

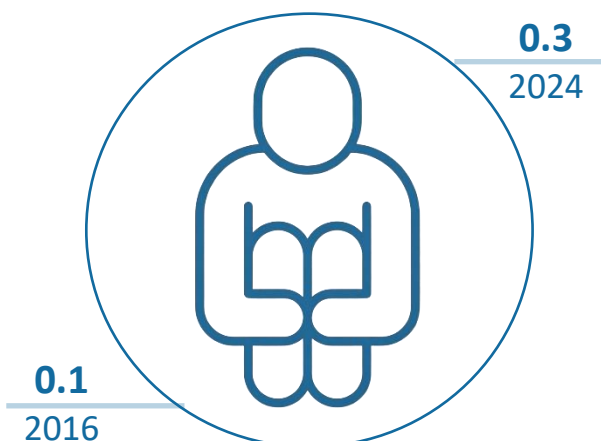

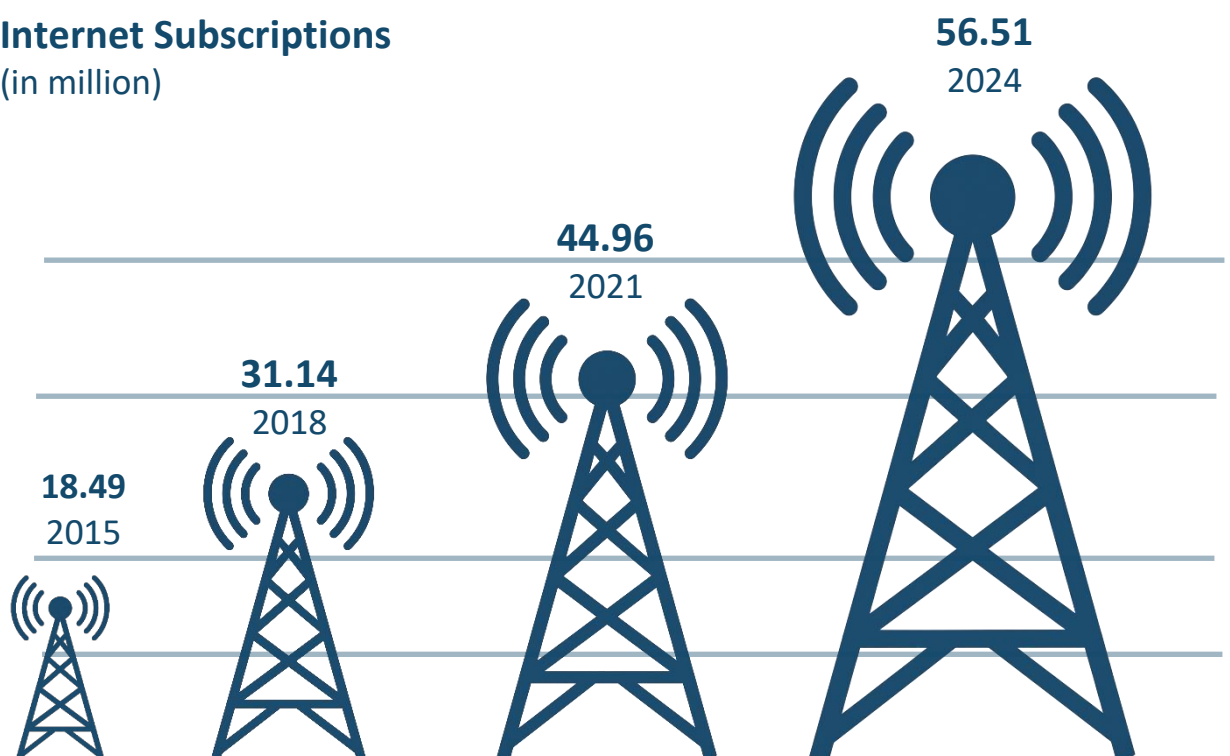

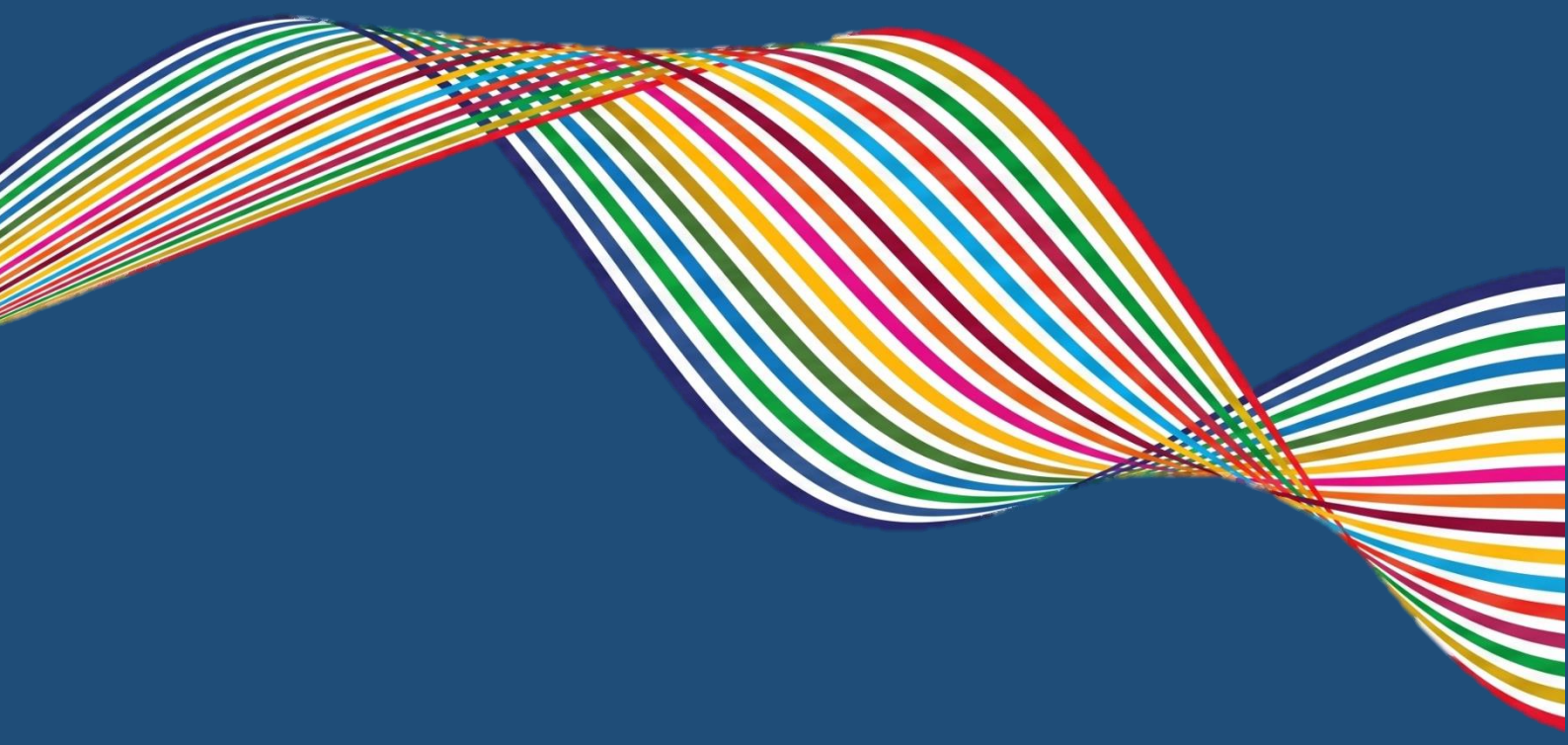


Fixed internet broadband subscriptions per 100 inhabitants

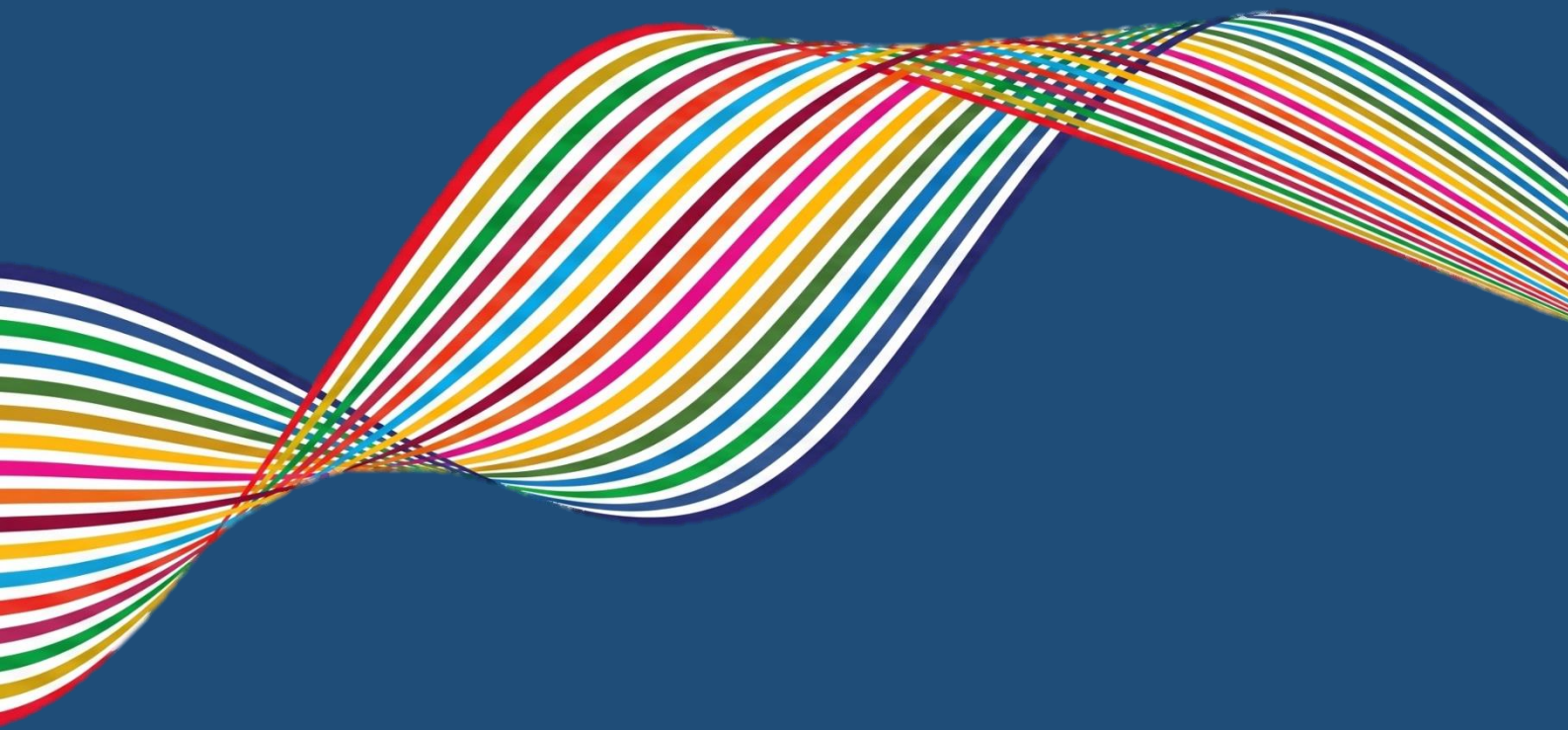


Total number of Internet Subscriptions (in million)

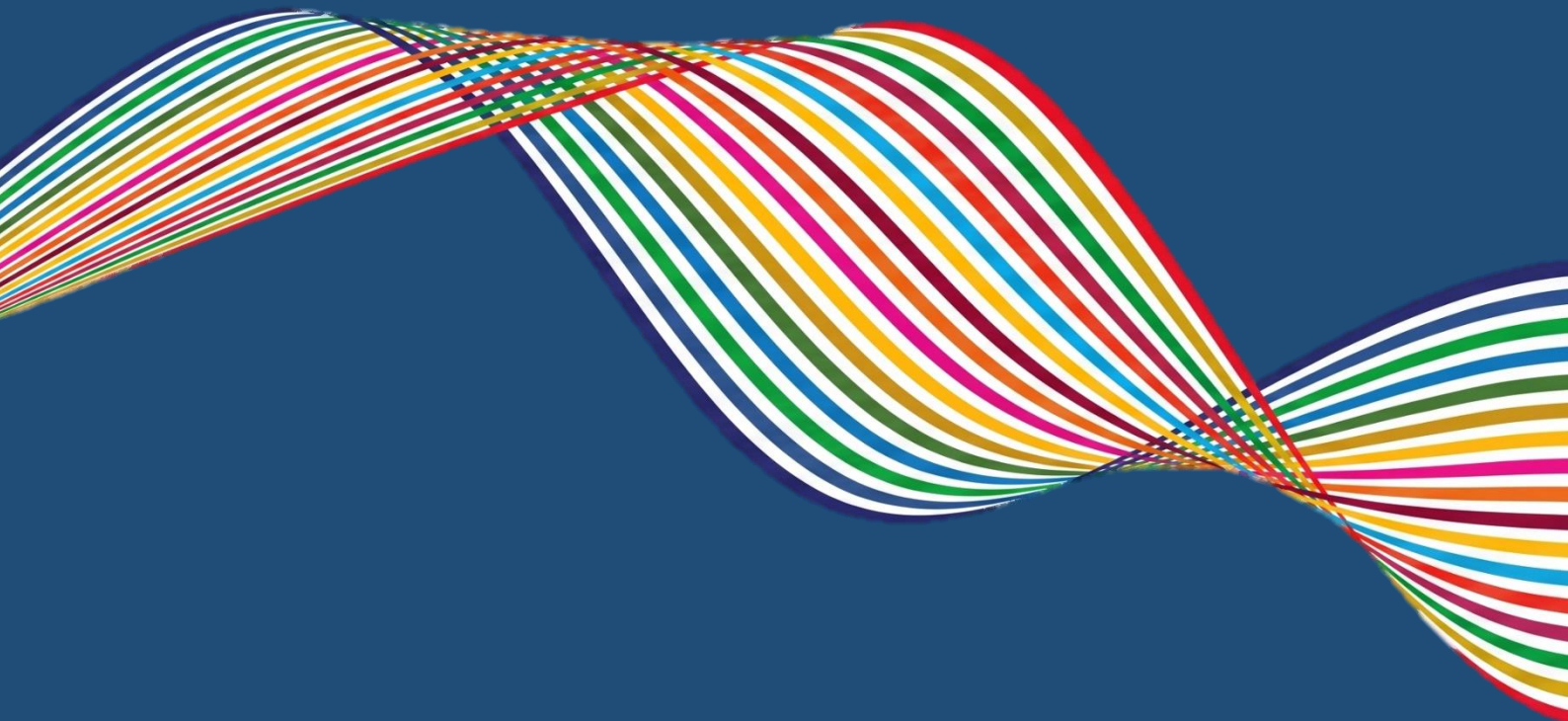

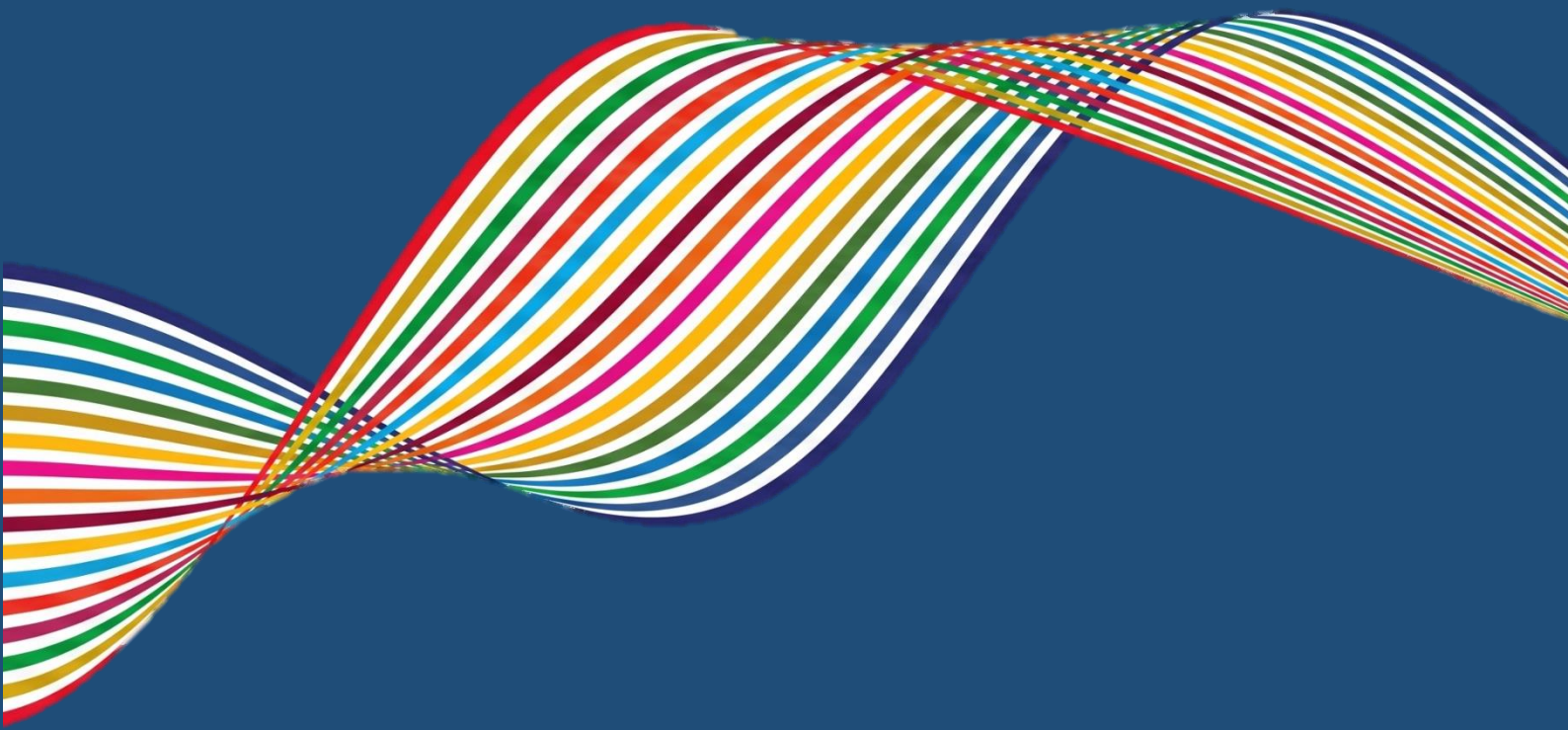
