


Head Count Ratio as per the Multidimensional Poverty Index (%)







Percentage of households with any usual member covered by a health scheme or health insurance











Maternal Mortality Ratio (Per 1,00,000 lives Birth)









Gross Enrolment Ratio in Higher Education (18-23 years)




Gross Enrolment ratio for tertiary Education





Sex ratio at Birth (per 1,000 male live births)




Female labour force participation rate






Percentage of households electrified



Share of renewable energy in total power generation (%)




Percentage of households using clean cooking fuel (LPG)








Unemployment and Labour force participation rate (LFPR) for the age






Manufacturing employment as a proportion of total employment




Annual Growth rate of real GSDP per capita (%)




Percentage of population with access to public transport




Number of road accidents




Daily average ridership in metro (in million)




Percentage ground water withdrawal against availability





Hazardous waste generated per capita (in MT/person)






Annual level standard of PM10, PM2.5, SO2, NO2, O3&CO



Number of wildlife crime cases detected and reported annually








Cases Reported under Prevention of Corruption Act & related section of IPC per 100,000 population






Number of judges (all levels) per lakh population


